

Today's Social Action Collection is for the African American Teaching Fellows (AATF). The AATF mission is to recruit, support, develop, and retain a cadre of highly qualified African American teachers to work in the Charlottesville and Albemarle public schools. Increasing the diversity of the teacher workforce is an important goal for both local school districts. There are currently fifteen "alumni" Fellows teaching locally and nine

teaching elsewhere in Virginia. Six Fellows were hired as new teachers for this 2015-16 school year. Six more currently preparing to teach will be seeking jobs in the summer of 2016 and 2017. The proceeds of the Social Action Collection go to provide financial support for Fellows preparing to teach locally, helping to pay for tuition, books and fees. In addition to financial support, AATF provides Fellows with mentors, introduces them to the Charlottesville-Albemarle community, develops strong cohort networks, and organizes professional development support in the form of an annual summer Teacher Leader Institute and regular workshops during the school year. AATF spends on average \$10,000 a year on each Fellow it supports. TJMC has been a strong supporter of AATF ever since it was founded ten years ago. Your contribution will support Fellows preparing to teach in our local schools in the coming year.
